These biscuits are true to their label--- they literally provide famine relief---protein, vitamins, and mineral enriched additives. Many thanks for making these available to the many who come to our gate needing help between meals,---and meals are only a once a day occurrence. Sr. Wendy oversees the distribution of these biscuits.

The possibility of an outbreak of COVID-19 is not unlikely. The predictions of extent can be calamitous. The National Government has unveiled a program of awareness regarding the virus telling us how to avoid it. But it is well known that south Sudan Health Services are NOT equipped to handle a crisis if such should develop.

May I once again offer my continued gratitude for all your generous support made more difficult this year because of the lengthy bushfire season and demands on you for more pressing needs. We are forever grateful in this year which marks the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our continuing presence in South Sudan.

The **LETTER of St. PAUL to the ROMANS** is the longest in the 14 letters we have in the New Testament. It is calculated by Scripture Scholars to have probably taken him about 96 hours to write because of the difficulties involved in the writing materials of the time. It is believed he wrote it from the Greek city of Corinth about the year 58 or 59 AD, (Remember the Crucifixion was in the year 30AD, so this is nearly 30 years later) In the closing farewells (16,22), his secretary (known as amanuensis), Tertius, records his name and adds his farewell to Paul's. The purpose of the Letter seems certainly to outline Paul's explanation of the Doctrine of Salvation by Faith in Jesus Christ. (To be continued)
