The Presentation of the Infant Jesus

This Remembrance of Christ's being presented in the Temple at 40 days old is the last echo of Christmas. It is expounded by St. Luke only, and tells us of a strange incident remembered well by Our Lady (who would've told St. Luke) where two old people came up to them as they entered the Temple to perform the Right of Presentation and Purification. We will read all about it in the Gospel.

This day takes its thrust from what the old man, <u>Simeon</u>, said. He speaks of the Baby being the "<u>Light to enlighten the Gentiles</u>". So because of his revelation, we speak of Christ as the Light of the World. **CANDLES** expel light, so today we use and bless Candles because they can be appropriately used as Symbols of Light, not just visible light but "The Light" that means the Revelation of Christ. Without this Light, we would know nothing of what is to come! The "Light" of Christ is the most fundamental light of all knowledge that we have on Earth.

Without this Light, we can't know what will happen after this life!

At the Blessing of any Candles, we use the following Antiphons:

Opening Antiphon: BEHOLD, OUR LORD WILL COME WITH POWER,
TO ENLIGHTEN THE EYES OF HIS SERVANTS, ALLELUIA

Beginning the Procession to the Altar, the Priest says:

LET US GO IN PEACE TO MEET THE LORD

During the Procession to the Altar, he recites the Canticle of Simeon beginning with the Antiphon:

A LIGHT FOR REVELATION TO THE GENTILES AND

THE GLORY OF YOUR PEOPLE ISRAEL (Three verses follow)
The Entrance Antiphon of the Mass follows as usual when the priest reaches the Altar.

St. AGATHA is another martyr from the last persecution of Christians, begun by Emperor Dioclesian in 304AD. It was eventually stopped by Emperor Constantine in 311AD. But by then many Christians had been put to death. Some of the most notable ones are mentioned in the 1st Eucharistic Prayer. Agatha was added in the 5th century. In the early Church she was famous. Two Churches were built in Rome in her honour. Sadly nothing of her story is known. There is a legend she was betrayed by a rejected suitor, but this can't be proven. That she existed there is no doubt. That she was famous, also no doubt shown by the many inscriptions about her, but why—unknown?
