From Fr Florito's desk

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception within Advent Season

The date of the eighth of December was chosen for the feast of the Immaculate Conception not because it has something to do with Advent but because it is nine months before the feast of the Nativity of Mary on the eighth of September. It is legitimate to ask then: how does this feast fit within the Advent Season?



Since Advent is the time for waiting for the Lord and time of preparing the way for Him, we find in the Immaculate Conception the most perfect example of a human being ready to welcome the Lord. Mary was waiting for the Messiah and when the angel brought her the message, she was willing to submit and accept the challenge. She was prepared for his coming in a very unique way by being totally sinless.

The Immaculate Conception, being a special and unique grace given to Mary only, cannot be followed by us. but some other truth connected with it can be proposed for imitation. For instance:

- 1. Mary was pure because of her closeness to Christ, and her call to become the Mother of God. This shows that the closer one is to Christ, the more he/she will be freed from sin.
- 2. Mary was graced by God in a special and extraordinary way. Each one of us has his own grace-filled situation. The feast of the Immaculate Conception could be an occasion to discover the special graces given to us and to reflect how much or how little we cooperate with them.
- 3. The Immaculate Conception is the feast of the election of Mary and how God prepared her for her calling. In life of every believer there is such a wonderful plan of God and a special vocation. The eight of December can become a day of deepening our call of God and to get more prepared to live it faithfully.
- 4. As Mary was well-prepared to welcome Christ at his first coming so must we get disposed to welcome Him in His second coming and in His coming in mystery (through sacraments, gathering and prayer). God Bless. Fr Florito



How to remain COVID-19 safe in the Church

- Do not come to Church if unwell/have flu symptoms.
- -Use QR code or write on sheet when entering.
- -Wearing of face masks is mandatory.
- -Keep 1.5metres distance when sitting on the pews (unless members of the same family).
- -Sanitise your hands before entering and after leaving the Church.
- Choir can comprise of up to 10 vaccinated people. **No congregational singing.**
- -Leave windows and doors open for ventilation.
- Wipe the pews with alcohol wipes after use.
- Avoid congestion outside church after Mass.
