## SACRED HEART PARISH South Mount Druitt

**From the Deacon's desk** ..... (to be continued) Many of you may not have heard who a deacon is and what a deacon does in the Catholic church. In fact, deacons have been around since the beginning of the church (see Acts 6:1-6). They were chosen to spread the Good News and be of service to the poor widows. For almost a millennium, they were



considered as the 'eyes and ears' of the bishop, and 'his right hand'. Perhaps the most famous deacons are St Stephen, St Laurence, and St Francis of Assisi. However, of the thirty-seven men elected as a pope between 432 and 684 A.D., only three are known to have been ordained priests before their election to the Chair of Peter.

The permanent deaconate disappeared in the Latin Church around the 10-11 century and only those who were to be ordained priests were ordained to what we call, 'transitional' deacons. The restoration of the diaconate as a permanent level of Holy Orders was decreed by Pope Paul VI in 1967 to implement the degree on the Church of the Bishops attending Vatican II. *"It is the duty of the deacon, according as it shall have been assigned to him by competent authority, to administer baptism solemnly, to be custodian and dispenser of the Eucharist, to assist at and bless marriages in the name of the Church, to bring Viaticum to the dying, to read the Sacred Scripture to the faithful, to instruct and exhort the people, to preside over the worship and prayer of the faithful, to administer sacramentals, to officiate at funeral and burial services. Dedicated to duties of charity and of administration, let deacons be mindful of the admonition of Blessed Polycarp: "Be merciful, diligent, walking according to the truth of the Lord, who became the servant of all." (Lumen Gentium para. 29)*
