

From Fr Flor's desk.

"My God, my God why have you abandoned me?"

This time of pandemic has been a challenging time for us believers. While we believe God loves us, with all the tragedies in life, as with this pandemic, wars, natural calamities, crimes and misfortunes, we cannot escape to wonder: has God abandoned us? Some preachers take the short cut conclusion that we might have angered God and so He brought about these calamities as punishment and so we need to repent and then He will stop it. Some would scare people to conversion as these are signs of the end times. But these views confuse us with the suffering and death of innocent people who may not need conversion and not consoling if our loved ones or ourselves are the victims. We need a better perspective from Jesus our Lord.

Jesus' cry of abandonment: "My God. My God, why have you abandoned me?" can give us a hint on how we can get through human suffering and tragedies as we trust in God's care. Pope Benedict XVI commenting on the cry of abandonment wrote: "Jesus is praying the great psalm of suffering of Israel (Ps 22), and so He is taking upon Himself all the tribulation, not just of Israel, but of all those in this world who suffer from God's concealment. He brings the world's anguished cry at God's absence before the heart of God himself. He identifies Himself with suffering Israel, with all who suffer under "God's darkness"; He takes their cry, their anguish, all their helplessness upon Himself- and in so doing He transforms it" (P. Benedict XVI, Jesus of Nazareth: Holy Week, 2011 p.214). Understanding the cry of abandonment this way, gives us insight that Jesus manifested His solidarity with us in our sufferings. He shed tears with and for us. Such a compassionate God who may allow natural processes in the world but not really abandoning us. So in times of crisis, God comes to us as a compassionate God, He would be our protector in times of danger as we may have heard spectacular survival stories, He would be our healer of our body and soul with recovery from illness or purification of the soul, He would come to us through carers and people who sacrifice themselves to care for us, He comes to us accompanying us in our death bed strengthening our faith and hope, He would come to us through other means to invite us to his gift of salvation. And so during experience of crisis we may also do the cry of abandonment with Jesus, expressing our anguish but also a prayer of trust in God's presence and compassion.


