Palm/Passion Sunday

The Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord liturgy is unusual with combination of two commemorations, the entry of Jesus to Jerusalem and the recalling of the passion. The liturgy is a combination of joy and sorrow, glory and humility, recognition, and rejection of Jesus. As every feast celebrated in our liturgical calendar is crafted carefully and has developed in time, so is the celebration of Palm/Passion Sunday. It is necessary then to see the rationale of coming up to this two-fold commemoration in one liturgy and be able to see its relevance in our growth in spirituality or Christian life. The following thoughts may be of help:

1. The liturgy is not just an imitation of an event that happened in Jerusalem more than 2,000 years ago. The external form is taken over from that time and place but the content is a message for today. As the people of Jerusalem recognised and accepted Jesus as their Messiah and King, so we too profess the same in our times and lives and commit ourselves to act accordingly.

2, The liturgy shows that he is a Messiah and King of a special kind. He does not come in a powerful and threatening position like other kings who rode in chariots and on horses, but Jesus came as the humble and peaceful saviour. In the liturgy of Palm/Passion Sunday the humility and powerlessness of the Messiah becomes very visible in the fact that after the celebration of the messianic entrance the Passion is proclaimed. The Christians must, therefore, abhor any position for political power, we have to change and transform the world and society not by power grabbing but by humble service.


3. In the liturgy of Palm/Passion Sunday glory and passion, life and death, acceptance and rejection are close together. This is how it was in the life of Christ; this is also how it will be in the life of every Christian, in fact of every human being. It is the painful experience of all of us that in one hour we hear the "Hosanna", and perhaps already in the next hour people will shout at us "crucify him!". As Jesus, the God-man came to experience the reality of human suffering, he assures us that he accompanies us in our experience of crisis and invites us towards victory of resurrection. He manifested to us that His passion and death is like a "dark tunnel" He had to pass through, and to come out victorious. As in His example, so is with us His followers: the final word is victory and glory and not suffering and death.

God bless and have a meaningful and reflective Holy Week. Fr. Flor

They would have known that something special was being conveyed through this story. They would have known that the story of his death was only a prelude to the real story of Jesus' passion - his resurrection.
