

From Fr. Bartholomew's Desk......

WHO WILL BE MY MESSENGER

From time immemorial, it has always been the ardent desire of God to communicate himself to mankind, in this way he makes known his will, ordinances and intentions encapsulated in his Divine Word to them. Succinctly this divine will must have a medium as well as a harbinger, thus the role of the Gospel-Bearers. In their bewilderment and naivety, they are summoned, in their imperfections they function, and grace is poured abundantly to their unflinching and unwavering effort.

For the messenger a voice must be heard. A calling/invitation too. But then, could it be the same voice as in the garden of Eden which summoned our First Parents Adam and Eve to the Divine Jury and left humanity in penury or the voice heard by Moses in the hot desert to untie his sandals which could be perceived as belittling for some since he was a leader of Israel or the voice which disrupted the quietude and tranquillity of Samuel and Elijah in their slumbers. How about the vindictive voice which Saul heard or the confirmatory voice of Sonship in the River Jordan and many others? Are they not voices? Are they all from God?

It is God who calls at different occasions and situations. The motive, tone and nature of the voice from God must be ascertained by the messenger who is called. The caller is always clear and distinct and has reasons for every invitation. Care must be taken so as not to misrepresent. Often times, the qualified are not called but naïve, unqualified and mundane persons are. He calls the unqualified and in His own way qualifies them, the imperfect he perfects to be perfected, The message and its contents is undiluted and must be announced as one.

Have you been called before? Did you answer? If yes, what was the message? Were you ever fruitful and impactful? If No, you must begin today. Your state of nature, status quo and cultural background or disposition does not count absolutely, but one's readiness. On the contrary how much work we do or who works hardest is not all that paramount, but that work is done and, in His name, for we can do the entire work in the world but when not in his name nothing happens, we still remain not credible.

Child of God, lover of God, arise and get started, commence the fishing work, never relent to work unworthy though you may be, even without the necessary paraphernalia or fishing tools. Just begin. You have a divine backup. Every day, strive your hardest to be a Good Messenger. Be a good listener. Be resilient and open to the spirit and decipher at each moment what God expects of you. What does the voice say to you today and in this week?

GO, FORGIVE AND FORGET, RELENT, PRAY, LAUGH, PEACE, PREACH, DON'T RETALIATE, AVOID EVIL, DO GOOD etc.
